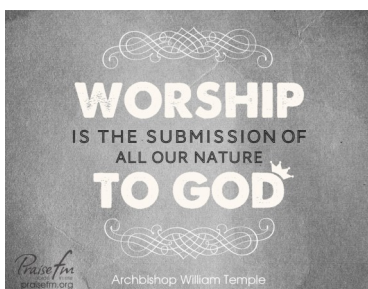

The record shows that laymen held places alongside the clergy during the formative years of the church. The **Lay Organization of the African Methodist Episcopal Church** is commissioned to teach, train, and empower its members for **lay** ministry, global leadership and service following the tenets of Jesus Christ.

The purpose of The Lay Organization is to organize and train the lay members of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, so that each member may utilize to the maximum the abilities and skills granted by God, in assisting in the improvement and extension of God's kingdom, and creating happiness, peace and harmony among its members.

To accomplish this purpose, below are just a few of its objectives:

1. To install in the membership of the church a love for, and appreciation of the history, tradition, and principles of African Methodism.
2. To keep forever alive the sacred memory of Richard Allen, our illustrious Founder.
3. To advocate respect and loyalty at all times to constituted authority and leadership.
4. To encourage the laity to support the total program of the church in the local congregation, in the community, and throughout the Conference and Connection.

The Lay Organization is a movement to provide greater leadership opportunities for the Lay members of the African Methodist Episcopal Church. Its membership includes Trustees, Stewards, Class Leaders, Missionary Workers, Ushers, Deaconesses, Stewardess, Choir Members, Sunday School Workers and Students, Young People Department, members of all Commissions.

Lay Organization Structure

The African Methodist Episcopal Church is a connectional organization. Each local church is a part of the larger connection. The organized lay are usually the ones involved in setting forth and recommending the new laws and structural changes as enacted by the General Conference.

The first tier of the Lay Organization is the **Connectional Lay Organization (CLO)**. Episcopal District Lay Organizations are organized in every Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in the Continental United States from the first Episcopal District down through and including the Thirteenth Episcopal District. The Connectional Lay Organization President is Matikane Abednego Makiti.

The Second Tier of the Lay Organization is at the Episcopal District level. We are a part of the Eleventh Episcopal District Lay Organization (Encompassing Florida and the Bahamas). Patricia Wright is its President.

The third tier is the Conference level. We are a part of the East Conference Lay Organization. Nicholas Causey is the President.

The fourth tier is the district level. The district lay organization falls under the umbrella of The Alachua-Central District Lay Organization. Brother Dennis Murphy Sr, is the President.

The fifth tier is the local (church) level. Sister Jacqueline Weston is the President of our local (church) lay organization. The goals of the local organization include study, worship, fellowship and service at the local, conference, district and connectional levels. Our aim is to be Christ-centered and to strengthen the church. The local lay organization's concern is for the total church and to maintain a happy working relationship between the Pastor and lay. The Lay Organization is a vital tool that can be used for effective change, if change is deemed necessary, or to improve existing conditions and methods.

Every member of the church who is not a Minister is a Laymen. Building a healthy and strong lay organization takes commitment from the local church. Your local lay organization is not built overnight. It will take time to develop. Organizing the lay in your church takes a group of individuals who are willing to devote time and have a thirst and willingness to learn thoroughly the connectional church.

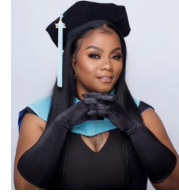
