Luke 24:44 (NKJV)

Introduction: Last week we discussed knowing the Word of God and how to explain it to non-believers. Tonight we will discuss Luke 24:44 that states, “These are the words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things must be fulfilled which were written in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms concerning Me.”

Lesson Outline:

Genesis 3:15

“And I will put *enmity* between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall *bruise* your head, and you shall *bruise* His heel.”

The serpent would *wound* the woman's Seed, but the woman's Seed would crush the serpent. The cross looked like Satan's victory, but it became the place of his defeat.

Supporting Scriptures Galatians 4:4–5 Hebrews 2:14 1 John 3:8

Jesus Was God's Plan from the Beginning

- Please note the impact that sin has on Adam and Eve's relationship with God and their attempt to cover themselves. Also note God's response to their sin (disobedience is sin) (Genesis 3:7-10; 21).

Isaiah 7:14

“Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel.”

Supporting Scriptures: Matthew 1:18–23

- Matthew fulfills Isaiah's prophecy about Jesus, who is the manifestation of God. (“If you have seen me, you have seen my Father” (John 14:9).

Life Application: What is the importance of Jesus being born of a Virgin?

Old Testament Prophecy About the Suffering of Jesus

Isaiah 53:1-12

“He was wounded for our transgressions; He was bruised for our iniquities (53:5).”

New Testament Fulfillment of Jesus Suffering Matthew 8:16–17 Matthew
27:35 Acts 8:26–35 1 Peter 2:21–25

- Please note what Isaiah states about Jesus. He would be rejected, suffer innocently, bear our sins, remain silent before His accusers, die among the wicked, and be associated with the rich in His burial.

Life Application: After reading 1 Peter 2:24, give your opinion on Jesus bearing our sins.

In these three prophecies (Genesis and Isaiah), we uncover what Jesus told the disciples concerning Moses, the Prophets, and even the Psalms, all pointing to Him.
